


YOUR GUIDE TO AUTUMN EFFICIENCY

Get prepared

Outdoor areas and seasonal maintenance

Autumn weather can put pressure on the exterior of your building. Proactive maintenance helps you avoid costly repairs later in the season.



Leaves and gutters

Regularly clear gutters, downpipes, and drains of fallen leaves and debris. Blockages can lead to flooding, damp, and long-term structural damage.



Rainwater collection

Install or maintain water butts and tanks to capture rainwater. This can be reused for irrigation, outdoor cleaning or landscaping, cutting down potable water use.



Exterior equipment

Drain and store seasonal equipment such as garden hoses and outdoor taps. Insulating or shutting them off helps prevent water freezing and pipes bursting.



Irrigation systems

Adjust or switch off automated watering systems as rainfall increases. Overwatering is wasteful and can damage plants and grounds.

Check inside before it gets cold

Prepare your plumbing and heating before the temperatures drop. This 4-step process helps avoid frozen pipes, prevents breakdowns and maintains efficiency.

1

Inspect pipework

Walk through your premises and check exposed pipes for cracks, drips or damp patches. Fixing small issues early helps avoid costly bursts later.

2

Insulate pipes

Ensure pipes in unheated areas of your business, like basements or service rooms, are insulated to prevent freezing and protect your water supply.

3

Test systems

Run heating and hot water before the cold sets in. Make sure radiators and thermostats are working properly, and schedule repairs if needed. 4

Service boilers

A routine service keeps equipment efficient, reduces energy and water waste, and lowers the risk of mid-winter breakdowns.

Spot leaks, save money


